

# CLAM SHELL SUPPLY LIST

**Class: Saturday, October 23, 2021**

Template masters will be handed out at class.

## **General Supplies**

- Sewing machine in good working order
- A patchwork foot (1/4" seam) presser foot for your sewing machine, if you have one.
- Extension cord, possibly a lamp
- Thread to match fabric
- Rotary cutter, cutting mat and small and large rulers
- Small 24 mm rotary cutter (opt.)
- Small scissors and dressmaker shears (something to cut fabric)
- White chalk marker or other white marking pen
- An HB Mechanical Pencil, sharpened or a thin washable pen (opt.)
- Fabric glue (opt.)

## **Specific Supplies**

- I am supplying a paper template master pattern for the clam shell (7.5" finished diameter). I recommend you bring some kind of plastic material to make a more durable template. Flexible plastic chopping mats work well but any type of durable material is appropriate. Instead of using the template I supply, you could purchase the 8" plastic clam shell template from a local fabric store and your quilt will be slightly larger finished size.
- Scissors to cut your plastic material (Kitchen shears work well.)
- A 1/16" hole punch (best size and optional). A 1/8" hole punch might work.
- A layout cloth. It is optional but very useful in this class, and for future quilts. (I use a flannel backed plastic table cloth but flannel fabric will work or batting.)

## **Fabric Requirements**

This quilt requires:

- 54 full clams
- 6 left borders
- 6 right borders
- 4 T-pieces (top)
- 5 bottom border
- 2 corners

which is 77 pieces. One can get five clams from a fat quarter so you need the equivalent of 16 fat quarters of fabric for the complete quilt. For best effect the quilt has the equivalent of 25% to 50% (15 to 25 clams) plain fabric or fabric that reads as plain (see sample photos). Also, as shown in the sample jpegs, if you want all your borders to be made of the same fabric you will need more than one fat quarter of that fabric.

So many choices! (For my first clam shell quilt it gave me an opportunity to buy a number of the 'cotton and steel' fabrics, combined with the shot fabrics by Kaffe Fassett.)
